‘Team 61’ shares successes with commissioners

Three local agencies are working together to uplift the community by attracting visitors, boosting the economy, and supporting local businesses.

At the Winchester Board of Commissioners meeting on Tuesday, June 3, updates were shared by the Winchester-Clark County Tourism Commission, the Industrial Development Authority (IDA), and the Chamber of Commerce.

Cindy Banks, executive director of the Winchester-Clark County Chamber of Commerce, said the Chamber’s mission is to promote the community. It does this through events like networking breakfasts, “Lunch and Learn” sessions, after-hours mixers, and ribbon cuttings.

Last year, the Chamber hosted:

- 17 breakfasts
- 18 after-hours events
- 12 ribbon cuttings
- 4 Lunch and Learns
- Sponsored 3 additional community events

The Chamber also runs the annual Leadership Winchester program and supports projects like downtown beautification and the Rock the Block summer concert series.

Currently, the Chamber has 448 members. Banks has served as executive director for 14 years and has more than doubled membership during her time in the role.
